Description of Available Plants*

R. parade – Deep pink fragrant flowers with an orange blotch in July. Developed by Weston Nurseries. They are hardy, and their mildew free foliage exhibits excellent fall colors.

R. serrulatum – The Hammocksweet Azalea produces small white, clove scented flowers in late July through August. This plant is usually the last native azalea to bloom. It is a tall plant—to 15 feet.

R. Pennsylvania (R prunifolium X R. viscosum) – Features light pink fragrant flowers in late July. Developed by Weston Nurseries. They are hardy, and their mildew free foliage exhibits excellent fall colors.

R. innocence – Beautifully fragrant white flowers appear in mid June. A compact plant with bronze-green foliage turning red in fall. Developed by Weston Nurseries.

R. austrinum – The Florida Azalea ranges in color from clear yellow to orange-red. It has a pleasant honeysuckle fragrance. It blooms in late March to early April and can attain a height exceeding ten feet.

R. calendulaceum – The Flame Azalea produces flowers that are variable in color—from distinct yellow through orange to red. Some forms may start blooming in early May, while others flower mid to late June. The blossoms are generally larger than the other species. The height can exceed ten feet.

R. vaseyi – The Pink Shell Azalea is a tall, upright plant that grows to twelve feet. The scentless, bell-shaped flowers are pink and appear before the plants' leaves.

R. arborescens – The sweet azalea is considered by many authorities to be the best of the native white azaleas. It is white, can be flushed with pink. The southern form of the plant blooms from July to August. It is a large plant ranging in height from eight to twelve feet.

R. canescens – The Piedmont Azalea have flowers that range in color from pure white to blush pink to strong rose, with a robust honeysuckle fragrance. It can be a large grower attaining heights from ten to fifteen feet. It is one of the earliest bloomers with flowers appearing in late March.
